Glassier OS Trail (PCOST)	5/1	PCOST	0	0 (PCOS&T is land manager, 5/1 is opening day). Cut back a few branches while accessing BLM.	
Buckhorn Traverse	5/1	BLM	39.75	5 Cut back corridor growth, Fix berm turn drainage issue.	
Imperial Gardens	5/29, 6/17	BLM	58	5/29: Tread improvements, drainage & corridor maintenance on lowest 1/2 mile. 6/17: improved lower set of berms and drainage structures.	
Crown Royale	5/13	BLM	10	0 Fixed drainage and berms on Lower CR.	
Overie	5/16, 6/26	BLM	140	5/16: Tread improvements, drainage & corridor maintenance, 30 STC staff hours (+ 80 volunteer hours). 6/26: 30 hours, tread improvements and pungie stick corridor cutback.

Mill Creek Trail	6/5,	WRNF	50	Cut out Mill Creek with chainsaws, removing ~10 trees and cutting back several more to widen the corridor. Additional check step work, installing 8 of those. Heavy duty rock armoring of the lowest creek crossing, rerouting it off the trail to minimize water runoff on the tread.	
Ditch Trail	5/30	WRNF	20	Cut out all but 1 tree, the ginormous honker laying across the trail. Limbed it up as to make it easier to pass through.	
Cattle Creek Trail	7/15, 7/16, 7/29	WRNF	93	7/15: Big day cutting out the lower 2 miles of Cattle Creek trail. Stopped counting trees after the first hour, but would estimate between Monday+Tuesday, about 80 trees. Plenty more to cut. 7/16: Continued chainsaw work on Cattle Creek trail. The deadfall gets nasty up here, big logs in complex cutting situations. 7/29: Long day, walked the entire trail and finished clearing all trees.
