- d. Crown Mountain Park has requested status update on connection to Rio Grande Trail.
 - i. Connecting Crown to the Rio Grande is a priority for multiple stakeholders, including Rebecca Wagner and Angela Henderson. The connection would benefit the community by providing a safe route for pedestrians and cyclists. The project would require collaboration with private landowners and careful planning to secure funding.
- e. E-bike Strategy with Eagle and Pitkin Counties
 - i. Should MVTC plan an e-bike trail with BLM on crown?
 - Some communities in Colorado have developed separate trails for e-bikes as a strategy for increasing trail access. The BLM is planning to present on allowing class one e-mountain bikes on the crown network and other trails. An etiquette campaign and signage will be important if e-bike access is increased.
